

### Percent of population foreign-born Source: OECD 2003






### New citizens annually per million population Source: OECD 2000






## Percent of foreign-born legislators, against proportion of population foreign-born Source: OECD 2003




# Immigration levels are too high 1977 - 2006




# Economic impact of immigration is positive 1993 - 2006






# Immigration takes away Canadian jobs 1985 - 2006





#### Influence of immigrants International data 2002




















### Focus Canada December 2006 survey

#### **GENERAL POPULATION**

- Survey of 2,045 adult Canadians
- Conducted December 8 to 30, 2006
- Interviews in English and French
- National results accurate to within ±2.2 percentage points (*in 19 out of 20 samples*)

#### **MUSLIMS IN CANADA**

- Survey of 500 adult Muslims
- Conducted November 30, 2006, to January 5, 2007
- Interviews in English, French, Arabic, and Urdu
- National results accurate to within ±4.4 percentage points (*in 19 out of 20 samples*)






Muslims are satisfied with the way things are going in Canada, even more so than the population at large












Impression of religion of Islam By frequency of contact with Muslims

Majority of Muslims think the quality of life for Muslim women is better in Canada than in most Muslim countries












What do you consider yourself as first?






Role of women in immigrant/ethnic communities

Banning of head scarves in public places, including schools










### **Conflict and Terrorism**

Struggle between moderate and extremist Muslims in Canada







Likelihood of terrorist attack in Canada by Muslim Canadians







Perceived support among Canadian Muslims for extremists like al-Qaeda






Population-at-large in Canada and Europe



### Opinion of Canada's anti-terrorism laws Canadian Muslims






### **Canadian Foreign Policy**



#### Muslims, like other Canadians, want Canadian foreign policy to promote peace-building, not active combat alongside allies


Preferred role for Canadian military





# Muslims disapprove of Canada's military participation in Afghanistan; Other Canadians are divided


Approve Canada's current military action in Afghanistan

### **In Summary**

- Canadian Muslims value Canada for the same reasons Canadians do: peace, order, good government, freedom and multiculturalism
- Discrimination and unemployment worry Muslims most about life in Canada; but they are mostly positive about life in Canada
- The more frequent their contact with Muslims, the more positive Canadians' impression of Islam
- Muslims feel Muslims are treated better in Canada than in other western countries, and that life in Canada for Muslim women is better than in most Muslim countries



### In Summary (cont'd)

- Religion is very important to Muslims, but much less so to Canadians, and their identity is more Muslim than Canadian, especially among the young
- Muslims want both to adopt Canadian customs (something Canadians doubt) and to maintain their traditional religious and cultural practices including the use of Sharia law for settling family disputes
- Muslims feel their religious identity is increasing but identify with moderates, not extremists
- Muslims, like Canadians at large, want Canadian foreign policy to emphasize peace building, not active combat, particularly in Afghanistan where Canadians are divided
